

**LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF THE CHARLESTON AREA**  
**2018 Election Calendar for Charleston Area Jurisdictions**

**Offices on Berkeley, Charleston and Dorchester County ballots in 2018 include:** Governor; Secretary of State; State Treasurer; Attorney General; Comptroller General; State Superintendent of Education; Commissioner of Agriculture; U.S. House of Representatives; State House of Representatives; Multi-county district offices; Solicitor (circuits 3, 5, 6, 12, 13, 15); various countywide and less than countywide offices. To see local races on a ballot (e.g., school board), visit the governing County Election Commission’s website.

Notes

*Lieutenant Governor:* The S.C. Constitution was amended in 2014 to require Governor and Lieutenant Governor to run on a joint ticket in the General Election. Recently, the General Assembly amended state law to provide rules for how Lieutenant Governor candidates will file for office. This calendar will be updated to reflect those rules once established.

*Adjutant General:* The State Constitution was amended in 2015 to provide for appointment of the Adjutant General by the Governor with advice and consent of the State Senate. Adjutant General is no longer an elected office.

**Voting:** To vote in a South Carolina election, the registration deadline is 30 days before that election (Mail in forms must be postmarked by that date). Polls are open on election days from 7 am until 7 pm. DMV office.
