

Summerville Town Council Meeting

Meeting Highlights

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM and adjourned to Executive Session at 8:00 PM.

Presentations:

Recognition of Miss Summerville Teen, Kathryn Liberstein.

Proclamation & presentation for Summerville Miracle League.

Recognition of city of Inman Youth Council and presentation by Inman Mayor Huff and members of the Youth Council. Mayor Johnson said he hopes Summerville will consider supporting a Youth Council.

Public Comments:

There were 55 minutes of public comments by citizens speaking against proposed annexation and rezoning ordinances, for the Bed & Breakfast ordinance change, one suggestion to reduce the speed limit on West Richardson from 35 to 30 mph and that a sign be posted, a resident of Olympic Club Drive requested that retention pond mosquito problem be solved, the entry intersection be improved to meet the required sight distance and something be done to address the unsafe traffic volume and speed in the neighborhood since work began on an adjacent housing development. There was a complaint re. road damage & garbage left behind by Waste Pro in the Weatherstone neighborhood and a request to return and safely display a Hirsch sculpture to the new Rollins Edwards Community Center at the Amory when the project is complete.

Approved:

1. Previous meeting notes, all Council Committee Reports and all Petitions, Pending Bills and Resolutions.
2. First reading for an ordinance for the Crescent Homes annexation from County to City was passed for discussion but with multiple concerns voiced by the council.
3. First reading but requested more information for an ordinance for a quit claim deed.
4. Authorization for funds to come from bond proceeds for contract with Wildwood Contractors for \$4,198,690 for the renovation of the National Guard Armory and a contract with Stantec Consulting Services to oversee the renovation.
5. The old National Guard Armory was officially renamed "Rollins Edwards Community Center at the Amory".
6. The Mountain Bike Trail project will move forward.
7. Implementation of Compensation and Classification Study.
