

Rosalee Keech has represented the League of Women Voters of the United States (LWVUS) as Chief Observer to the United Nations (UN) since 2011 and has developed programs to increase women's leadership and participation in democratic political processes, to promote democracy around the world, and to prevent violence against all women and girls.

Elected in June 2014, she served on the Board of Directors of the LWVUS and the Board of Trustees of the League of Women Voters Education Fund until June 2016.

She formed the Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) Coalition for Alliance 8.7 to stop forced labor and trafficking by working with UN agencies, member states, academia and the private sector. Additionally, she has developed a comprehensive strategy to prevent exploitation of women and children. Through her work in conjunction with the UN, the strategy has been adopted and implemented by governments, both foreign and domestic.

As a result of outstanding service with the United Nations, Ms. Keech became a member of the New Jersey Attorney General's Human Trafficking Task Force and chair of its Outreach and Awareness Committee. She is a governor's appointee to the New Jersey Board of Professional Planners and member of the Board of Directors at the Jewish Home at Rockleigh.

Ms. Keech is a retired Information Officer with more than 30 years of experience in developing and executing system strategies for the private sector. She graduated from Rutgers University with a BA in Economics and Education and has an MBA in Finance from New York University.
